

THE BURY CHEST

Sir Richard de Bury (1287-1345) son of Sir Richard Aungerville, was Bishop of Durham from 1334 until his death.

- 1) AUNGERVILLE : Gules, a cinquefoil ermine within a bordure sable besanty
- 2) DURHAM : Gules, a cross statant argent between four cinquefoils ermine
(Combining the cross statant argent of the See of Durham with the cinquefoils of Aungerville).
- 3) ENGLAND/FRANCE - occasionally used pre-1340 by Edward III (1327-77)
- 4) NEVILL : Gules, a saltire argent
(Raiph, 2nd Lord Nevill was appointed overseer of the temporalities during the absence of the Bishop. This same Lord Nevill spent much of his time fighting the Scots and he enjoyed victory at the Battle of Durham or Neville's Cross (1346)).
