

CATARACT OPERATION



The measuring madine eye piece for selecting the correct lenses



The operation begins. Lying flat your face is covered except for the chosen eye.

A very bright light is shone into the eye. The centre is bright blue edged with white and surrounded by pinkish yellow cloud



The catavact is gently removed until everything becomes fuzzy

Cataract gone

The new Cens is implanted and everything is bright



Trails of light as the eye is sealed with the new lens in place

There may be some after-effects =



After-effect which lasted about 2 days:
Crimson stain incentre of vision - green when eye- is closed





BEFORE CATARACT OPERATION

Everything looked dull, yellowish and fuzzy with multiple images -(three or four white sails) AFTER CATARACT OPERATION AND WITH TETRAFLEX LENSES IMPLANTED

All is bright, clear and clean looking-

I first painted these impressions before and immediately after surgery. My Surgeon, Mr S. Kumaravel, at the Duchy HOSpital, Truro, Cornwall UK found them very interesting, as none of his previous patients had done anything of this kind. I thought you, too, would find them of interest and have repainted them for you in This little book.
